International Studies provides an interdisciplinary, focused area of study as students fulfill their basic Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer (AAOT) degree requirements. All classes prescribed on this page will transfer and count towards an AAOT degree. International Studies may NOT be offered as a major at the transfer institution. It is best to check with that institution. As long as degree requirements are fulfilled, however, International Studies students may declare alternative majors upon transfer. Below, 36 credits of coursework are outlined for International Studies. To complete an AAOT, students need a minimum of 90 transferable credits, and can transfer up to 108 credits. Please note that many combinations of courses are acceptable. (See AAOT worksheet/counselor for additional options.) In addition distribution requirements must be met as outlined.

NOTE: It is recommended that students participate in a study/travel abroad program via **IS 210 (Comparative Cultures)**. It is a 1-6 credit option that students may use during a formal study abroad program or for an informal personal trip.
